There have been various Departments working under various centres like the Centre of Research, Training, Extension, Education and Toy Science to set the quality benchmark in the holistic development of children and child-centric research studies. It has been mentioned in the NEP-2020 that 80% of a child's brain develops at the age of 8 in the chapter-2..., and hence the University runs Tapovan-Garbhsanskar Kendra for pregnant women where they have been provided various activities like chanting Sanskrit Shloka, logic and reasoning activities, reading of holy scriptures, values system etc. The infant is instilled with positive values right from the womb of the mother and then from birth to 3 years of age, the children are provided various activities to develop their skills, values, Body movements, and cognition at Shishuparmarshan Department. The University also has provision of Vidyavatika under the part of Vidyaniketan school where children up to 6 years are provided Balavatika education with the University's own panchkosh-based curriculum.

Further, the University aims to carry out research studies on child-centred holistic education and the University is going to allot more than 40 research projects to the University and outside university faculty members. There have been developments of teaching-learning resources, toys, materials, Majano Khajano, books and research publications with patents through various departments, Toy Science Centres and faculty members. The University developed a New Toy Science building through the CSR Fund provided by BPCL where the Toy Innovations, development and pedagogy of Toy Science shall be carried out. Above all these explain the University is altogether different and unique in comparison to other conventional universities. Establishing norms, standards and quality in research innovation, education, knowledge expansion, teaching-learning and the students' welfare are the key principles of each University. The sustainable development of society depends upon the quality of education, Highly professional and committed teachers, innovative and quality holistic education practices, research and advancement in science and technology.

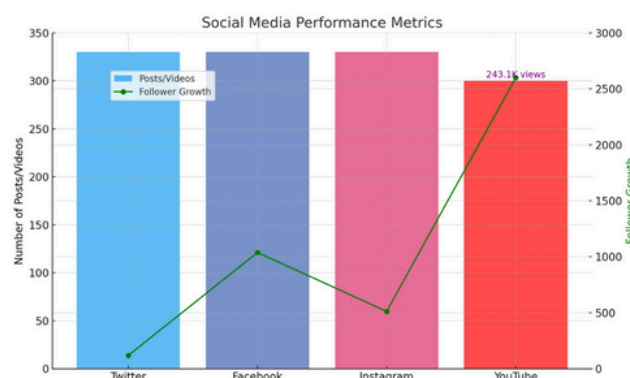
Instagram:

8. Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell of the university carried out various activities to set the benchmark in quality education. The details of the activities are as follows.

A. Quality Improvement in Education through Toy-Based Pedagogy

The discussion session on “Quality Improvement in Education through Toy-Based Pedagogy” took place from 26-28 September 2023 at Children’s University. The event aimed to explore the use of toys as educational tools in various learning environments, emphasizing their potential to enhance children's engagement, motivation, and cognitive development. The session featured a distinguished panel of experts, including Prof. Pawan Sudhir from NCERT, Mr. Archit Bhatt from the Tripada Foundation, Prof. Gayatri Menon from NID, Mr. Lalan, an artist and designer from NID, Dr. T.S. Joshi from Children’s University, and Ms. Tithi Bhatt from the Tripada Foundation.

The first session focused on "Toy-Based Pedagogy," highlighting the significant benefits toys offer in enhancing children's cognitive, social, and emotional development. The participants underscored the importance of carefully selecting and utilizing toys to create more interactive and engaging educational experiences. The second session on indigenous toys emphasized their role as carriers of cultural heritage, educational tools, and sources of economic empowerment for local communities. Despite challenges like competition from mass-produced toys and declining interest, there was a consensus on the need to preserve and promote indigenous toys by integrating them into educational systems and supporting local artisans.

In the third session, "Listing Indigenous Toys and Games," participants successfully identified a wide range of traditional toys and games from various indigenous cultures, recognizing their cultural significance and educational value. The discussion highlighted the importance of documenting these toys and games, engaging with indigenous communities, and incorporating them into educational curricula to safeguard cultural diversity and promote cultural pride among future generations. The fourth session on "Art Integrated Education in Schools as per NEP-2020" brought together various stakeholders to explore the concept, benefits, challenges, and strategies for implementing art-integrated education. This approach aligns with the goals of NEP-2020 and has the potential to enrich students' educational experiences. The session concluded that further discussions and collaborative efforts among educators, parents, and the community are needed to make art-integrated education a reality. The valuable insights and suggestions gathered during this session will serve as a foundation for future planning and decision-making regarding art integration in the school curriculum.



B. Capacity Building Programme for Master Trainers on Equitable and Inclusive Education for Gujarat State

The Capacity Building Programme for Master Trainers on Equitable and Inclusive Education for Gujarat State, held from December 11 to 15, 2023, was a collaborative initiative organized by the Department of Education of Groups with Special Needs (DEGSN) at the National Council of Educational Research and Training (NCERT), New Delhi, in partnership with the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) at Children's Research University, Gandhinagar, and the Faculty of Education (IASE) at Gujarat Vidyapeeth, Ahmedabad. The programme commenced with an inaugural session featuring distinguished guests, including Mr. Mahesh Mehta, Secretary of Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA), Gujarat, and included a ceremonial lamp lighting and welcoming addresses by key figures such as Dr. Jignesh Patel, Dr. S.C Chauhan, and Dr. T.S. Joshi. Throughout the sessions, various experts addressed crucial aspects of inclusive education. Dr. S.C Chauhan discussed the inclusion of socio-culturally disadvantaged groups, emphasizing strategies outlined in NEP 2020. Prof. Vinay Kumar Singh highlighted the importance of addressing diversity and equity in classrooms, with a focus on provisions for socio-economically disadvantaged groups and initiatives like the Inclusion Fund and Gender Inclusion Fund. Uttam Kumar and Akhil Paul from Sense International, Ahmedabad, provided insights into understanding and addressing the learning needs of children with disabilities, emphasizing early identification and tailored educational interventions.

Dr. Sneha Bansal and Dr. Dhananjay Deshmukh explored curriculum adaptation, Universal Design for Learning (UDL), and differentiated instruction to cater to diverse student needs. Dr. Gugulothu Balaji highlighted the integration of ICT and assistive technologies, showcasing tools to support students with diverse needs and discussing the use of Open Educational Resources (OER). Dr. Ajitkumar emphasized the importance of continuous and comprehensive evaluation, competency-based assessments, and reducing reliance on high-stakes exams, in alignment with NEP 2020. Dr. Akhilesh addressed adolescent mental health concerns, stressing the need for mental health education, supportive school environments, and collaboration with mental health professionals.

The programme successfully provided master trainers with the knowledge and strategies necessary to advance equitable and inclusive education practices in Gujarat, aligning with the provisions of NEP 2020.

On 13th December 2023, the programme commenced with Dr. Gugulothu Balaji from NCERT, who discussed the importance of making science classrooms inclusive. He provided practical strategies for including children with visual and hearing impairments in science education. This session underscored the responsibility of teachers in creating an equitable learning environment for all students. Following this, Prof. Asfa M. Yasin from PSSCIVE highlighted skill education and entrepreneurship, stressing the need to appreciate diverse abilities and equip students with practical skills for the workforce. She discussed the integration of the National Skills Qualifications Framework (NSQF) into school curricula, ensuring alignment with industry needs and preparing students for successful transitions into employment.

The programme continued on 14th December with Dr. Hemant Maurya from IITE, Gandhinagar, who addressed inclusivity in social science education by incorporating diverse perspectives and culturally relevant materials. Dr. Sneh Bansal's session on the Index for Inclusive Schools highlighted the need for physical accessibility, assistive technologies, and differentiated instructional practices. Dr. Suresh Makwana's second session integrated arts and toy-based pedagogy, promoting hands-on, interdisciplinary learning. Dr. Triloki Prasad concluded the day with a focus on inclusive physical education, discussing adaptive sports and legal frameworks supporting inclusive practices.

On 15th December, Prof. Mona Yadav from NCERT discussed integrating gender concerns into school education, aligning with the NEP 2020 vision. D. Workshop for CAS Matter for Faculty who are not directly engaged in Teaching

On Monday, 13th May 2024, at 3:00 PM, an online meeting was held for the committee constituted to address matters related to the Career Advancement Scheme (CAS). The primary agenda of the meeting was to discuss and resolve issues concerning CAS applicants who were not engaged in direct teaching.

The committee revisited the resolutions made in the first meeting and made several key decisions. Firstly, they approved a list of suggestive activities (Annexure-1) under various Centers, Departments, Branches, or any other assigned or initiated work to substitute for direct teaching for faculty members engaged partially or entirely in direct teaching for the PBAS (yearly) or PBAS for CAS. Faculty members are now permitted to document activities from this list in Table-1 of the CAS.

Furthermore, faculty members who had previously submitted their PBAS (Yearly) and PBAS for CAS and mentioned relevant details in any part of the proforma will be considered for Table-1 of Direct Teaching. Those who did not include such details in their submissions will be asked to add the necessary information and resubmit.

The evaluation criteria were also discussed, aligning with the UGC Regulation 2018 norms. For direct teaching in serial no. 1 of Table-1 (CAS/PBAS-Yearly), the performance evaluation will categorize 0-15 activities as not satisfactory, 16-29 activities as satisfactory, and 30 or more activities as good.

To ensure the integrity of the verification, screening, and selection process, a Verification and Screening Cum Evaluation and Selection Committee will be provided with Annexure-1. This structured approach aims to recognize and evaluate the contributions of faculty members through various approved activities, ensuring fair and comprehensive assessments in the CAS process.

9. Centre of Research

The Centre of Research at Children's University is a pioneering centre for advancing the knowledge and understanding in the field of holistic development of a child. Established with the vision of creating a brighter future for children, the centre serves as a hub for cutting-edge research and innovation.

A. Department of Testing and Evaluation

In this department, research is conducted in various fields across psychosocial aspects for the holistic development of the child. This gives a unique identity to the child's personality, which contributes to the building of a new India in the future.

C. Department of Research in Language

It is one of the core departments operating under the Centre of Research. The department envisions establishing a strong culture of initiating innovative research in the realm of different national and international linguistic traditions. The department aims at locating the base of language development in the formative years of a child. Over and above it is to look at different literary aspects pertaining to the development of a child.

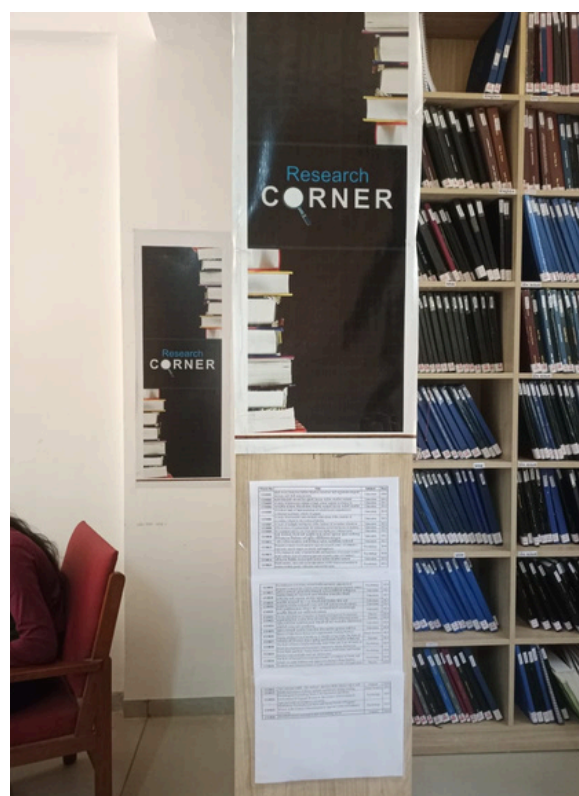
D. Department of Research in Maths and Science

Activities of Center of Research

Research Corner

Library is a vital part of the research. Children's Research University has rich library. It contains thousands of Books, Journals, Magazines, Thesis, Dissertation, Reports etc. There are many sections in the library, but there is a lack of the Research Corner. Center of Research has taken the initiative to make a section dedicated to Research Work. It was the need of the University as it was upgraded to a research university. A Research Corner with a reading facility was created to uplift the research work of the University. There are more than 200 Books on research in the corner. All the research work done by PG students. M.Phil. Students and Ph.D. students are kept in the corner. Research Projects done by the CRU faculties are also kept in the corner.



Research Proposal Invitation and Evaluation

Children's University Act, 2009 emphasized on Research. The Center of Research is one of the core centres of the University. The Center of Research invited proposals for the research projects in two areas; Holistic Child Development and Tool Construction. This initiative was taken by Dr. Minalba Jadeja, Head of the Testing and Evaluation Department under the Guidance of Prof. Sanjay Gupta, Director of the Center of Research. For the purpose application for the grant was initiated under the name of Manomay Kosh and Vigyanmay Kosh. Children's Research University received 60 lack Rupees. The applications were invited by the nationwide advertisement. A total of 62 Proposals were received in both the areas. Presentation of the proposal was carried out and an evaluation was done with the help of national level experts.

Research on Pariksha Pe Charcha: A Counseling Programme for Students on Examination

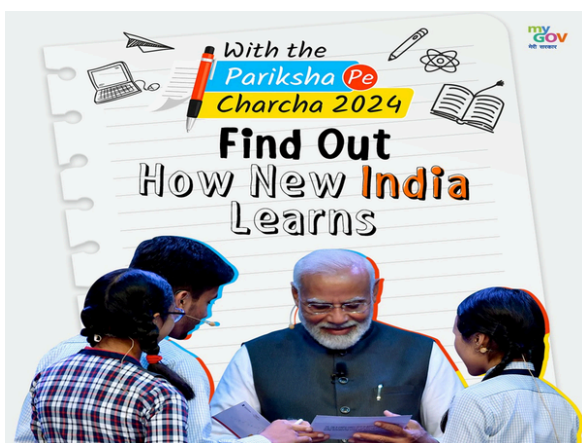
The 'Pariksha Pe Charcha' program is a program implemented as a movement at the national level. This was envisaged by the Prime Minister of India Narendrabhai Modi in 2018. The fear of exams affects the life of students in many aspects. The program is aimed to convert the exam into a joyous festival; by providing some tips to the students by direct conversation with Hon. Prime Minister.

Attitudes of individuals or societies change over time. Seven episodes of the program 'Pariksha Pe Bracha' have been aired. Every student, teacher, policy maker and parents are participants of the the 'Pariksha Pe Charcha' program through various media. This can gradually have a positive effect on their mind. Testing and Evaluation department has taken initiative under Center of Research to know how the program has changed students' attitude towards the examination.

All the faculties of the Children's Research University participated in the program under the guidance of Prof. Sanjay Gupta and Dr. Minalba Jadeja. Total 370 students took part in the study form 33 district and Union territories. Semi-structured interviews with students were conducted online using Google Meet. All participating students were interviewed.

From the Analysis, many benefits of this program were found. Students reported that after this program, the students felt a lot of relief in matters like exam fear, anxiety, stress, disappointment etc. and positive things like motivation, self-confidence appeared in them. Their attitude towards the examination changed and the students felt that it was a festival, an opportunity. They also got guidance regarding exam preparation and also learned what to do during the exam. Not only students but also parents and teachers got guidance.

They got guidance not only about the exam but also about preparation for life in which the students learned things like values education, physical health, overall development, and were inspired to implement them. The students felt & relaxed by this program on the day before the prelims exam, their minds were enlightened and relaxed. Overall, the program imparted knowledge along with positivity. The success of this program can be gauged from these things.



Research on View of Youth on Vikasit Bharat@2047

Everyone's contribution is important to make India develop, but as India is the youngest country, it is natural that the most important responsibility falls on the youth. These youths have been given a call by the Government of India. Some motivating questions were asked by the Government to make the youth of India creative by awakening them to an ideological revolution to develop India. A survey was conducted by the Center of Research to get answers from teenagers. A qualitative analysis of the results of this survey was done with reference to the data received from a total of 286 youths. The analysis of each question is as under. All the faculties collected data from the Youth under the guidance of Prof. Sanjay Gupta, Director of the Center of Research.

Question 1:- How should India be developed in terms of various aspects in the year 2047?

The youth's responses revealed that they are most concerned about employment, education and equality. But not much talked about industries, and other economic upliftment. Moreover, things other than material things such as values, and spirituality are not concerned.

Question 2:- What do we need to do to reach this goal?

It did not appear that the youth answered this question by thinking very deeply. Most of the youth answered that they would work hard. They didn't talk much about various dimensions like economic, political, social, environmental etc.

Question 3:- What can you do to make developed India @2047 possible?

Although there were no in-depth responses to these questions, it can be said that there was a fair amount of variation in response. The youth expressed their thoughts in various dimensions like economic, political, administrative, technological, personal, and social. If we take an overview of this information, it will be realized that the most concern of the youth is about employment, but for that, they think only about jobs. Very few youths have talked about job creation, entrepreneurship and industries. The solutions given by the youth for developed India did not show that they had any deep understanding of what they should do to become developed or, what they should do for their future. Their understanding was limited only to education and employment. Of course, very few youths have talked about adopting Swadeshi, reducing corruption, paying taxes on time, taking specific steps to preserve the environment, etc. The rest of the youth did not seem to have much understanding of what to do from their answers.

10. Centre of Extension

The Centre of Extension is established by the CU Act, 2009, Section 6(4)(iii). The real education of a child starts from the mother's womb. Couples who wish to have children should plan before conception. According to Indian scriptures, one can get a bright child by following balanced Ahar, Vihar and Sadachar. The Center of Extension provides essential services of education and guidance based on Indian scriptures and contemporary research. Childcare-education guidance services to expectant mothers, families and teachers for the holistic development of the child, learning materials and guidance are provided through television, ICT and social media to the families, teachers and institutions regarding all aspects of child development from pre-birth to eighteen years.

The Center of Extension is also working to provide services for the excellence of early childhood education institutions. The centre provides guidance and educates every individual and organization including the government and private sector regarding childcare.

A. Department of Tapovan

The Department of Tapovan undertakes Garbhadhan Samskara and Garbha Sankar to produce the best, the most unique, and divine progeny. Indian sages have relied on Garbha-Vigyan and Garbha-Samskar to produce greater children for millennia. Focusing on the Motto - "Every Child Matters" and the concept of Pavhkoshiya Vikas, the Department of Tapovan offers a wide range of services, such as Garbha Samskarin both virtual and brick-and-mortar classrooms, as well as seminars, workshops, and awareness programs. Workshop on Prenatal Education: “A Journey towards Holistic Child Development”

On the date of 29th January 2024, Monday a Doctor workshop was organized by the Department of Tapovan, Centre of Extension, Children’s Research University at IITE Auditorium. For this program total 18 numbers of participants from diverse backgrounds i.e, Ayurveda, Physiotherapist, Dentist, Gynecologist, and Homeopathy were present. Dr. Rupam B. Upadhyaya introduced the role of Tapovan at the beginning of the workshop. Apart from this, a summary of the research findings regarding Tapovan Garbha Sanskar was informed to all. To share about the latest concept and to gain some information 3 experts were invited. Among them our first expert was Shri. Divyanshu Dave, former V.C of Children’s University delivered a lecture on Prenatal Education: Ancient and Modern Perspective. In his lecture he shared some unbelievable experience and effect of Garbhsamskar on the mother and child lifespan. He gave detailed knowledge about different types of Samskar which require during lifespan such as, Annprashan, Vivah, Garbhadha, Garbhsamskar and so forth. He also highlight about innovative research scope area such as effective process of samskar, varying birthing process and their effect on child and mother health etc. He also suggested a quality book for 7 intelligence skill associated with womb and that name is “Windows to the Wombs”. Overall, he shared his best knowledge and that can help to the all participants as well as university researchers to do research on untouched areas in various samskars. For the program second expert was Dr. Karishmaben Narvani, she is renowned person in Ayurveda and deliver her lecture on “Research in Garbhsamskar”. Presently she is working as a Director of Garbhpnishad Foundation Jamnagar, where all various stream like Gynaec, Radiologist, Ayurvedic are working together and especially focusing on research on garbhsamskar. She shared different research effect and their results on mother and infant mind during the pregnancy period. Her research and result proved that music, book reading, and thinking process of mother all have strong effect on growing infant. She also told about Garbhadhan samskar where a fertile egg covert in the zygoat and the infant journey will start successfully. In conclusion her entire research shows that our ancient culture and traditions having strong ability and that can be served as a best practice in this modern era. Dr. Darshanbhai Bhimani was our third expert and he is famous Gynaecologist in Gandhinagar who prefer normal delivery of patients. Being a Gynaecologist and dealing with modern practices but still he is adapting concepts of Garbhsamskar and their effect on pregnant lady. 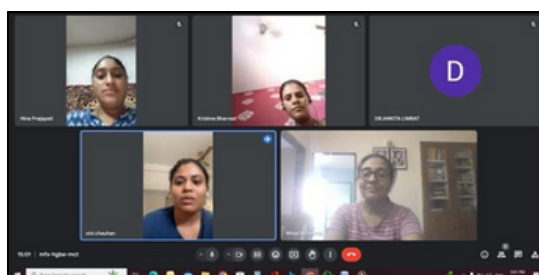
MOU

Gaining a deeper understanding of the nature of each subject becomes essential through material acquisition. In addition to making the educational process more engaging and exciting, learning and teaching tools should also promote active learning, the acquisition of new abilities, and the adoption of positive values and attitudes by students.

Department Work

- In the month of February 2024, Department TLR received a Work order for a Rs. 22.50 Cr grant project from Samagra Shiksha Abhiyan, Gandhinagar Gujarat. The major work of the project is to deliver 15,000 toy kits based on learning outcomes in Balwatika for standard 1 and 2 students. The entire kit has total 18 numbers of toys along with physical and digital learning material.
- Majano Khajano, which comprises Tapovan, Shishuparamarshan and Vidyaniketan digital and physical materials of various subjects. All three departments' digital material work is published on the Children's University YouTube channel. A total of 504 videos are published and 2,247 viewers have already seen these videos. Along with this, video QR codes are generated and kept in the specific book to make easy access to all beneficiaries.

11. Centre of Education

The Centre of Education has been established vide Children's University Act (CU Act), 2009, Section 6(4)(ii) of the Children's University. The objectives of the centre are as follows aligning to the objects laid down in Section 5 (6 & 7) of CU Act, 2009.

A. Department of Research Program

The prime aim of the department is to offer Ph.D. in child-centric as well in the subject of holistic development of the child. Presently, the Department offers Ph.D. in total seven subjects i. e.: Education, Psychology, Sanskrit, Gujarati, Home Science, Mathematics and Physics. As the State University, students pursuing full-time Ph.D. are getting monthly Rs.15000/- fellowship for the period of two years with Rs. 20,000/- contingency annually under the SHODH scheme of the Department of Education, Government of Gujarat. A total of 32 faculties of the university are recognized as Ph.D. in the subject of holistic child development. The progress of the Ph.D. students is periodically assessed by RAC and RDC members.

B. Department of PG and PG Diploma Program

The curriculum of the all programs is child-centric and having required credit structure as per UGC norms. Presently, Department offers four PG Programs: 1. M.A. in Psychology 2. M.A. in Sanskrit 3. Master of Social Work 4. M.Sc. in Food and Nutrition. Dedicated to holistic child development following the guidelines of credit framework of UGC as suggested in NEP 2020, University proposes the 4 major Post Graduate Programs on Early Child Care and Education: 1.M.A. in Early Child Care and Education 2. M.A. in Child Literature and Language Development 3. M.A. in Human Development and Family Education 4. M.Sc. in Child Centric Food and Nutrition.

C. Department of UG Program

The curriculum of various UG and certificate program will be dedicated to holistic child development following the guidelines of credit framework of UGC as suggested in NEP 2020. University proposes the following Graduate Programmes on Early Child Care and Education which are to be linked to PG programmes as described in credit framework of UGC: B.A. in Early Child Care and Education, B.A. in Child Literature and Language Development. B.A. in Human Development and Family Education, B.Sc. in Child Centric Food and Nutrition.

D. Department of Enrichment Program

The Department of Enrichment Program shall conduct various enrichment programs for the school, institute, university and the stakeholders of Gujarat and across the state in order to instil the knowledge, skills and positive attitude for the holistic and constructive development of the child. The major functions of the department are to undertake transformative initiatives for the holistic development of children of various age groups, to organize need based academic, social and cultural program for the stakeholders, propose the grants for organizing various enrichment programs, place the details of the enrichment programs in the activity calendar of the Centre of Education, prepare various proposals for need based training programs, follow up and remediation tasks and evaluation and assessment, carry out seminar, workshop, symposium and other need-based programs on parenting and holistic development of child, establish links with various universities, institutions and organizations for planning and organizing various enrichment related activities.

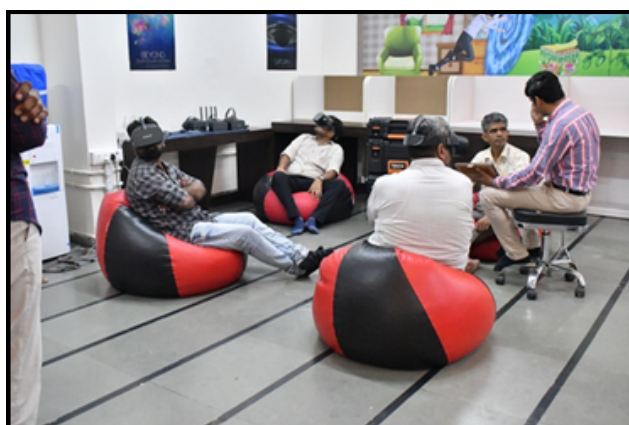

14. Gijubhai Badheka Chair

The Gijubhai Badheka Chair is a memorandum of understanding between the Ministry of Women and Child Development, Government of India, and Children's Research University, Gandhinagar, established in 2023. The chair's main focus is spreading the ideas, values, thoughts, and philosophy of the remarkable educationist Shri Gijubhai Badheka, especially in the field of Child Care and education.

Objectives of the Chair

1. To provide advanced Centers of learning where Anganwadi Workers, Elementary Education Teachers, Child Care and protection duty holders, scholars, and students would enrich and advance studies and research to understand, assess, disseminate, and implement Shri Gijubhai Badheka's ideas and thoughts.
2. To engage in research and in turn contribute to the advancement of knowledge in the area of the study particularly in the discipline of Elementary Education, Holistic Child Development, Language, Child Rights, Philosophy, Human Rights, Sociology, Social Work, Law, and other disciplines.
3. To publish the outcome of the research studies in the form of scholarly articles in the peer-reviewed indexed journals from the UGC-CARE list and as books published by reputed national and international publishers with strong peer-reviewed policy.
4. To develop appropriate methodologies to translate and transmit Shri Gijubhai Badheka's ideas of elementary education and holistic development of children into practical propositions and policy instruments.

A variety of activities were handled under the chair in order to bring consideration to its goals. These activities in the Chair's first year establish a foundation for its continued work in promoting Gijubhai Badheka's legacy and shaping the future of holistic child development.

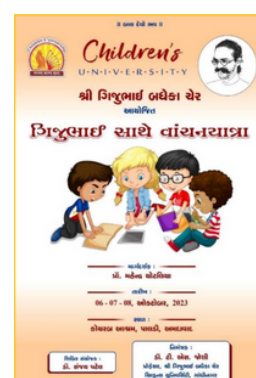
Gijubhai Sathe Vachanyatra - Re-reading Gijubhai Badheka

This workshop focused on revisiting and exploring the extensive works and contributions of Gijubhai Badheka. Participants engaged in in-depth discussions and analyses of his writings, educational philosophies, and the impact of his experiments in the field of education. The objective was to renew interest and understanding of Gijubhai's methodologies and thoughts among educators, students, and researchers.

Exploring Live Teaching-learning Practices of Gijubhai Badheka's Educational Philosophy in Contemporary Institutions

The exploration of live teaching-learning practices in institutes adhering to Shri Gijubhai Badheka's educational philosophy aims to observe firsthand how his principles are integrated into contemporary educational practices. Specifically, visits were made to exemplary institutions such as Shri Dakshinamurti Balmandir and Bal Adhyapan Mandir (Pre-school Teacher Training Institute) in Bhavnagar, Gujarat, [established by Gijubhai Badheka himself in 1920, where Gijubhai has done his experiments in education through various activities] and Shardamandir Balmandir in Paladi, Ahmedabad, Gujarat. Children's Story Creation

The National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, Chapter 4.6 emphasis storytelling-based pedagogy; which was mentioned in the book 'Vartanu Shashtr' by Gijubhai himself in 1925, the Gijubhai Badheka Chair initiated a project to create children's stories recognizing the significance of stories in education. Similarly, other meetings were organized focused on authenticating, finalizing, and giving finishing touches to the materials, especially the publication of the book 'Gijubhai Sathe Shikshan Yatra'. This book is a collection of educational paragraphs for students, teachers, and parents, drawn from 17 different books by Gijubhai Badheka. The review process followed the workshop 'Re-reading Gijubhai Badheka,' which involved in-depth discussions and analyses of his writings.

Users: The primary users of the finalized materials include students, teachers, parents, educators, and researchers interested in Gijubhai Badheka's educational philosophy and methodologies.

Book Publication

The Gijubhai Badheka Chair is committed to producing high-quality educational literature that reflects the pioneering educational philosophies of Gijubhai Badheka. The team has planned to publish a series of books for students, parents, teachers, educators, etc. The initial publications— "Gijubhai Sathe Shikshanyatra," "Shishukathao," and "Shishukavyo"—are significant steps towards this goal, offering valuable resources for its readers. The entire process of publication is being carried out by the chair and publication expenses are covered by the Publication Branch of Children's Research University.

1. Gijubhai Sathe Shikshanyatra

A three-day workshop entitled "Gijubhai Saathe Vanchan Yatra (Re-reading Gijubhai)" was conducted at Kochharab Ashram, Ahmedabad to assess contemporary relevance and practicality of Shri Gijubhai's educational principles and philosophy that consolidate valuable content for teachers, parents, and children.

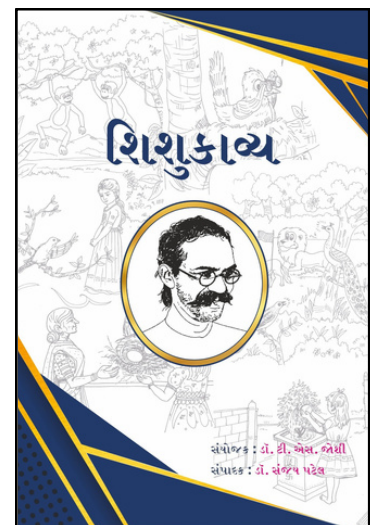
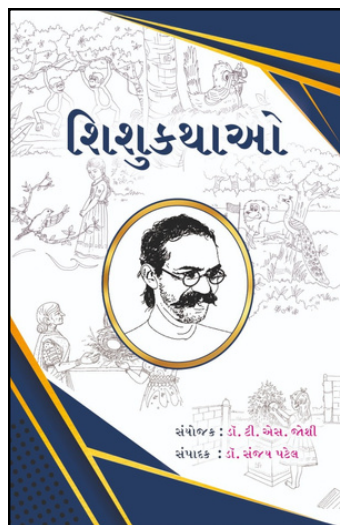
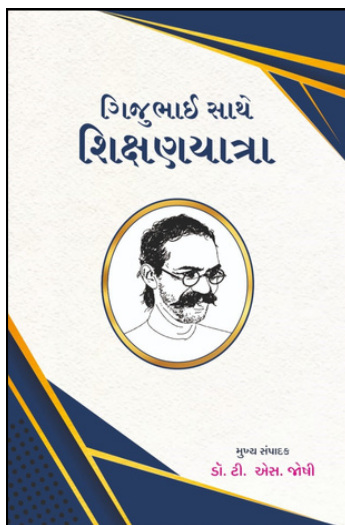
Workshop participants from various educational fields read Gijubhai Badheka's books and identified significant paragraphs related to education that reflect Gijubhai's educational philosophy. Compilation of those paragraphs has been done in order to publish them in book format. Subsequently, review meetings were held at Shri Dakshinamurti Institute, Bhavnagar and Children's Research University to finalize the book content. Under the task of book publication, initially 'Gijubhai Sathe Shikshanyatra' is in the process as an outcome of the mentioned activities.

2. Shishukathao

A workshop was organized to empower writers and teachers to craft stories to make the teaching-learning process of particular subjects more interesting. The workshops resulted in the creation of 48 children's stories. From these, 30 stories were selected for publication entitled "Shishukathao" as engaging children's literature in the educational field.

3. Shishukavyo

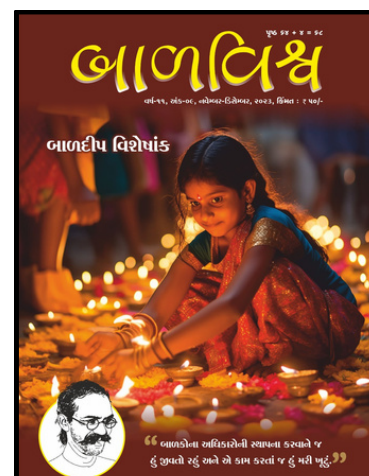
Thirty-two contemporary children's poets in Gujarati literature were invited to craft children's poems as an initiative to create enriching children's literature. This collaborative effort resulted in the contribution of 115 poems, out of which 60 have been finalized for publication. This collection, entitled "Shishukavyo," will be significant for children's learning especially for language education.



Bal-Visheshank : A Special Issue in Balvishva Magazine - Monthly magazine of Children's Research University

As part of the initiatives to promote and disseminate the educational philosophies of Shri Gijubhai Badheka, the Children's Research University published a special issue of its monthly magazine Balvishva, titled "Baldeep Visheshank" (Year 11, Issue 9, November-December 2023).

The Gijubhai Badheka Chair played a pivotal role in providing valuable reference materials for this issue. This special issue includes 20 articles covering various aspects of Gijubhai Badheka's life, literature, experiments, and philosophy related to child care and education. These articles were contributed by various experts in the field, ensuring a comprehensive exploration of Gijubhai's contributions.



Digitalization of Gijubhai' Literature Work

The digitization project aims to preserve and make accessible the literary collection of Shri Gijubhai Badheka, which includes his published works, as well as literature related to him, such as the 'Shikshan Patrika Monthly' magazine run by Gijubhai himself and the 'Dakshinamurti Patrika' run by Nanabhai Bhatt. The collection, housed at Dakshinamurthi and Gandhi Smriti Library in Bhavnagar, spans nearly a century and is currently in a state of severe disrepair.

Users: The primary users of the digitized collection would include researchers, scholars, historians, educators, students, and anyone interested in the literary and educational legacy of Shri Gijubhai Badheka. Additionally, educational institutions, libraries, and cultural organizations could benefit from access to these digitized materials.

Literature Quest : Uncovering Unpublished Literary Treasures

The initiative aims to uncover previously unpublished literary works associated with Shri Gijubhai Badheka, thereby enriching our understanding of his contributions to literature and education. A comprehensive search is underway to locate such materials in institutes closely linked to Gijubhai, such as Shri Dakshinamurti Institute and Gandhi Smriti in Bhavnagar, as well as Sharda Mandir and Sheth C. N. Vidyalaya in Ahmedabad; Shreyash Foundation: where Madam Montessori visited the place by herself and prepared curriculum for 3-5 Age group students with Shri Leenababen Sarabhai (Educationists). Collaboration with scholars, historians, and experts familiar with Gijubhai's life and work is essential to identify hidden literary treasures.

Users: The primary users of the uncovered literary treasures would be scholars, researchers, historians, educators, and anyone interested in the life and work of Shri Gijubhai Badheka. Educational institutions, libraries, and cultural organizations could also benefit from access to these materials for academic and archival purposes.

Research Repository

The establishment of a research repository focused on Gijubhai Badheka aims to centralize and preserve valuable research works related to his life, work, and contributions to education. A search was conducted on 'Shodhganga'* to identify existing research conducted at the Ph.D. level by scholars from various institutes and universities across India.

Outcome: A comprehensive list comprising 25 research works has been compiled, showcasing the depth and breadth of scholarly inquiry into Gijubhai Badheka's legacy. Furthermore, to ensure accessibility and long-term preservation, a local repository has been established to securely house the downloaded theses in hard format, safeguarding them for future reference and study.

Collection of Books & Children's Literature

Gijubhai Badheka is been given a name of “Bal-Sahitya na Bramha (Brahma of children's literature)” by Kakasaheb Kalelkar as he laid the foundation of the understanding of children's literature and the systematic method of child education in Gujarat, has abundantly published informative yet enjoyable literature in various genres such as poetry-stories-drama that nurtures children's interest, stimulates their curiosity, awakens their imagination, and becomes a part of their personality- building. It has opened a new direction in children's literature by presenting the material found in the surrounding life in a simple and attractive form without consuming encyclopedias. The Bal-mandir activities created by Montessori method have also been an inspiration in all of his children's literature writings. Gijubhai Badheka Chair has tried collect as many books from various resources to make available for students, parents, teachers and other educationists.

Outcome: The concerted effort to collect Gijubhai Badheka's works has resulted in a comprehensive repository of his literature, encompassing a wide range of genres and topics. This collection is a vital resource for understanding his contributions to children's literature and education.

Impact on Users: Access to Gijubhai Badheka's extensive work allows users to explore and implement his educational principles and methodologies. Students can enjoy and learn from his engaging and informative stories, while parents and teachers can gain insights into effective child-centric education and parenting techniques.
